Abuse Awareness and Background Checks

Overnight volunteers (bible teachers, kitchen help, trading post, crafts, etc..) need to be trained in an Abuse Awareness Training and participate in a background check. The training for this and the background check are under the staff link on our website. There is presentation, curriculum, worksheet, and exam. Dress Code Policy

Shorts may be worn during the day with a guideline that the hemline hits fingertip length or longer. No nike type wind shorts where the sides are shorter. Long pants or capris' will be worn for some evening activities. No spaghetti strap, midriffs, or razor back tank tops may be worn without a t-shirt underneath. Guys/Girls big armhole sleeveless shirts are not to be worn – nor girls with sports bras underneath showing. Swimsuits must be appropriate – a one piece is preferred for females. No bikinis, midriffs showing, or speed-o briefs. Camp leadership reserves the right to make decisions if the need arises on situation basis

Cell Phone Use

Under no circumstance should campers be allowed to use your cell phone. If you feel like a camper needs to call home, please inform the director and the director will make the decision to allow the camper to use the phone or not. There are situations beyond common knowledge that would put a camper, staff, or yourself in jeopardy if you were to let campers use your phone.

Photographing Campers / Social Media

Please do not take pictures of campers and post them on your personal social media site (pictures of your children or children that you have a personal relationship with are an exception). We have a photography policy and not all campers are allowed to be

photographed – please contact the director if you have a question about this policy or to ask about specific campers.

Prohibited Items

The use and possession of illegal drugs, tobacco, firearms, explosives, and alcoholic beverages of any kind is forbidden at all times.

Visitors

Camp is for the kids and we try to limit distractions from the outside world as much as we can during the short time we have them. We also need to know who is on the campgrounds with our kids. You must check with the director before inviting someone to visit camp if it is outside the designated times for visitors. (Please contact the director for designated times)
